# Board of Selectmen Meeting Minutes 4/18/2018, Rhodes Building, 6:00pm

**Open:** Selectman Martell opened at 6:30pm. **Minutes** held off until after CCA discussion.

# CCA discussion with Todd Ford, HCOG Executive Director

Pelham is currently using Colonial Power as their Aggregation agent with contract set to expire in January 2019.

HCOG currently offers 3 services/programs related Energy.

Hampshire Power is a new model of buying local energy, saving money, and supporting local community. 100% of excess revenue is returned back into the area employing local people.

Hampshire Renewables offer Net Metering Credits for a 15% discount off both residential and commercial electric bills. The credits are sourced from community solar, low impact hydro, wind farms, and cow power through anaerobic digestion.

The newly created and locally funded **MA Renewable Energy Trust** is a new generation of energy controlled by communities who choose to invest. Some of the green products pricing appear below the base Eversource rate. Energy Trust products offer 100% pure additionality; solar, wind, hydro, biogas, and geothermal.

## **Minutes & Norms**

Motion by Selectman Martell to table Norms until after Town Elections, not seconded.

Selectman Pearson asked SC to read aloud her additions on page 2 from the minutes on 4/4/18, Website Discussion. Edits were not shared with the Town Clerk previous to the meeting. Selectman Martell recused himself. Handout from 12/6/17 BoS meeting to remind everyone of the majority vote, which added no swearing and assume goodwill to the Norms document. Miscommunication about why board members trying to change the current posting that Town Clerk handles. The AG office's did not have an official posting on file for the Town which needs to be updated. Request going forward that the BoS Chair control and direct discussions during meetings to the best of their ability. Handout from Page 9 of the MMA Handbook about the role of the BoS Chair. Suggestion to have short recess when Norms have been breached and have BoS continue to be civil and assume goodwill.

Minutes were not voted on.

# **Review and Recommend Town Meeting Warrant Articles**

Discussion of order of ATM warrant articles. Reminder from Town Clerk that the Attorney stated at ATM in 2017 that business/budget articles of the Town should be addressed first on the warrant. The Finance Committee meeting posted on 4/5/18 was not jointly posted with BoS. If any BoS member attended the FC meeting on 4/5/18, then no deliberation could ensue as BoS Chair, Selectman Martell, is on both the FC and BoS. Selectman Pearson showed up at the FC meeting but left at the beginning as she was told that it may cause an OML violation if there is any deliberation due to its posting. No OML violation occurred as the Attorney General's office communicated to Selectman Pearson. Other BoS members not

on the FC would have liked to engage in ATM warrant discussion with the FC but find it challenging to do so.

Any items that townspeople would like more discussion/information about can request a "Hold" during the ATM. All warrant articles requiring a dollar amount must be filled before ATM.

### **PEG Access Account**

Town counsel responded that the PEG Access Account cannot be used to fund the broadband connection to the Town of Shutesbury that 2 households were requesting. "PEG" is Public, Educational, and Governmental Access. The petitioned article related added onto the ATM warrant can be amended on the floor if needed by the residents who submitted originally.

## **Net Neutrality Letter of Support**

Letter (not on hand) from Amber French of Media Democracy, for support of Net Neutrality. Asking for BoS to sign letter of support. Item will be added to 5/2/18 agenda.

# **Appoint Animal Inspector**

Motion to appoint Nancy Long as Animal Inspector, seconded Selectman Pearson, unanimously approved.

# **Statewide Environmental Justice Policy**

Letter read from Boston City Councilors to support the Commonwealth to reduce toxics in the State. Motion to sign Environmental Justice Policy letter, seconded Selectman Ribeiro, unanimously approved.
