Agenda Item #1

- ~ Work Day: Either 12/3/16 OR 12/10/16, meet on site at 10:00 a.m. to cut timbers, clear uncleared plots, move compost onto pollinator garden.

3) Wendi (NOFA notes) and one other person do workshop on different ways to preserve food: dehydrating, freezing, canning, fermenting (Gabor?)

CREATE a poster board in December with photos from Heidi and Roger, reflecting the garden in full swing this past summer.

At each of these workshops 'advertise' the community garden, showing poster board.

BRAINSTORMING PUBLICITY IDEAS TO GET THE WORD OUT ABOUT THE COMMUNITY GARDEN:

- a) Host a movie night at the library with film relevant to community gardens/local growing ideas / etc.
- b) In early Spring at application time show up on recycling day with flyers & applications

- d) Pelham School Fair (when is it?) have a 'Plant your own seeds' table there.
- e) Some of us help with the Spring Pelham Plant Sale that benefits the library.
- f) Organize a garden tour in Pelham that focuses solely on growing food. For example Abbie's, Sue's, Pedro & Maital's gardens, and others.

Agenda Item #1

Water Tanks have been drained; they do not need to be covered for winter; leave them in place; clean inside now or in the Spring.

Agenda Item #2

Rick Adamcek runs the town mowers_& is in charge of town maintenance - The town funded this project, we believe they should maintain that field.

Agenda Item #3

Pollinator Garden - Would like update from Sue and Heidi as to intention with the cardboard and leaves. What's next!?

Agenda Item #4

The equipment Pelham uses to clear saplings is shared by four towns. Rick is waiting to receive it, so we can have rehicle access at the stone wall garden site opened up. This will make it easy for cars and small trucks to access the Jarden if the parking area is full.

Agenda Item #5

End of Season Plot Care-Wendi will send out an e-mail to the gardeners regarding cleaning out plots for winter. Language will be taken from the 'Rules & Guidelines' (item #6 in packet) given to them at time of registration. It was suggested that next season we charge \$40 a plot, \$20. refundable at end of season when their plot is cleaned out. That gives gardeners additional motivation to take that responsibility.

The South Hadley Community Garden said it took 3 years to gain momentum and energy for their garden.
