Meeting convened at 7:07 pm

- 1. Announcement: This meeting is being held online per order of the Governor and Attorney General.
- 2. Motion to not record the meeting was approved.
- 3. Motion to approve the minutes of our February and March 2020 meetings by Dana and seconded by Judy.
 - a. A discussion arose not about the minutes, but about providing more oversight to the work done by contractors who we hire; since there is concern that the Meeting House paint job was substandard.
 - b. The committee agreed to put this discussion on the agenda at a future meeting.
- 4. Dana: The Fennessy purchase is one acre bigger, so let's go back to the original donation amount of \$36,000 for 48 acres instead of 47.
 - a. Motion made by Tom, seconded by Dana
 - b. After a short discussion the motion passed 5 yes, one abstain (Cyd).
- 5. Motion; Create a one page mailer for our public hearing on May 21. Seconded.
 - a. Warrant articles on page 1
 - b. Instructions on how to join the meeting on Zoom in page 2
 - c. The motion passed unanimously.
- 6. Motion to approve new language for the Affordable Housing project at 20-22 Amherst Road.
 - a. Why is the term "non-binding" used? Because the language must detail how much and from where the money comes; and "non-binding" because town counsel wanted to emphasize that future town meetings may choose to vote against spending any money for this project.
 - b. Judy commented that more town boards (ConCom, BOH, and ZBA in particular) need to approve aspects of this project.
 - c. Tillman interjected that, in essence, various negotiations and approvals are necessary and that if the project fails to gain those approvals then the town would not spend this money.
 - d. Low income is 80% of the median income in western Massachusetts which is about \$60 64k for a family of 4.
 - e. Vote to approve 4 (Cyd, Dana, Tom, Jim, Joe) to 1 (Judy).

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- 7. Motion to extend the first time homeowner's program to September 2020. Seconded.
 - a. This plan costs \$42,000 per family, \$30,000 to the family and \$12,000 for administrative costs paid to Valley Community Development Corporation.
 - b. We will have to notify the Selectboard and Town Accountant.
 - c. Tillman will ask the Town Counsel to update the legal documents.
 - d. VCDC agrees to extend to September, 2020.
 - e. Motion passed 6 to 0.
- 8. Dana: We will table the last agenda item (Review/Approve return of completed or inactive project fund balances to the Undesignated Fund Balance.) until a future regular meeting, perhaps June 18.
- 9. Meeting adjourned at 8:12 pm
