
# Pelham Historical Commission Meeting MINUTES

### Renovation of Exterior of Pelham Hill Church/Museum

Bids will be opened on the 25<sup>th</sup> of July. Sara Chase will be here this Sunday afternoon. Will inspect church building from the ground, but might want to look at the upper parts also. This inspection will thus establish a baseline for the building. We will inform her that we put the same specs in the bid as for town hall painting. She should be able to tell us if we are trying to do to much. Highway Dep. will provide high ladder to get up high. Shutters are also in her purview so she should advise what we should do.

#### **Cemetery Commission Project**

Joe and Buzzy had conservation about needs regarding the cemeteries, which could be addressed with CPA funding. Joe also did take some pictures of the conditions of some of the graves stones, so that we could send them to consultants to see what needs or could be done. Trees have been coming down on the walls, some gates need to be maintained and very little money is available for it. Can't just have the highway department go in with loam or shovels. Instead need expert opinions to give advice on restorations and set priorities. Should be possible to pay for it with CPA money. Joe mentioned that he found a specialized commercial Website that has the names and dates of all people buried in town (except Quakers). He will forward this information to the cemetery commission. In addition Kindahl's son several years back copied all the names from the stones that were still readable.. Buzzy suggested a visit to all the cemeteries, so that he wouldn't be the
