COVID BOOSTERS OR THIRD DOSE

COVID-19 booster shots are available for eligible residents and those who work or study in Massachusetts.

If an individual received **Pfizer or Moderna**, it has been <u>at least 6 months</u> since their second dose and are:

- 1. Ages 65 years and older
- 2. Ages 18 years and older and have <u>underlying medical conditions</u>
- 3. Ages 18 years and older and work or live in high-risk settings

If an individual received **Johnson & Johnson**, it has been at **least two months** since their initial dose, and are:

1. Ages 18 years and older

Individuals are able to get any type of vaccine for their booster shot but may want to check with their health care provider if they have questions or concerns.

WHERE TO FIND A BOOSTER OR INITIAL DOSES OF COVID-19 VACCINE

More than 460 locations offer booster doses, with appointments available for booking. You can schedule appointments online at https://vaxfinder.mass.gov or you can call the COVID-19 Vaccine Resource Line from 8:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday - Friday or 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday by calling 2-1-1. The Vaccine Resource Line is available in English and Spanish and has translators available in approximately 100 additional languages.

You can also contact local pharmacies and retail stores with pharmacies directly. Most have online registration available and also take reservations over the phone.

The Amherst Health Department also has vaccinations available from 3 to 6 p.m. on Thursdays by appointment. More information is here. https://www.amherstcovid19.org/vaccine
