Residents who want to vote at the annual town meeting must be registered to vote prior to the event. A copy of the Annual Town Meeting warrant is included inside this mailing.

## **Planning Board Updates & Projects**

Town meeting was a revelation to me when Jeff and I came to town in 1969 as newlyweds and had our first encounter with local government in action. The Planning Board was asking for \$500 to pay a lawyer to sue the Zoning Board of Appeals and the ZBA was asking for \$500 to pay a lawyer to defend itself. It was an animated meeting, but Pelham was clearly a welcoming place where anyone with energy and interest could get involved just by



showing up, listening, asking questions, and giving opinions. Trust in the open democratic process was high back then and people showed up to serve, make the rules and enforce them.

The Planning Board has a lot of plans for the coming fiscal year. We'd love to have your input as we set priorities! One of our key goals is to get other boards and committees to see how their particular concerns fit into the job of the Planning Board so we all can work together more effectively and efficiently.

#### A PARTIAL LIST OF ONGOING WORK THE PLANNING BOARD HOPES TO DO FOR YOU:

- Finish and print an updated version of our zoning bylaws
- Complete a review of zoning and general town bylaws to prepare for and help direct future growth— especially in the Village Center. We want to ensure that our bylaws are without exclusionary or discriminatory language and that development is in keeping with Pelham's rural character and environmental needs and priorities.
- Study the need for and complete bylaws, regulations, and definitions for approval at town
  meeting of several issues that have been raised regarding: storm water management,
  cannabis, earth removal, driveways, town wide dark sky regulations, and adding associate
  members to the Board.
- Increase professionalization of the Board by providing training for those interested in planning in whatever capacity they serve the town so that what the Planning Board has accomplished won't get lost when the roster changes and everyone understands their legal roles and responsibilities.



#### **Pelham Seniors: Lock Boxes Available**

A lock box is a small secure box with a combination that holds your house key. The location and combination will be on file with the Pelham Police Department and the Dispatch Center.

When an emergency call comes in, the dispatcher will inform the responding officer or paramedic of the lock box location and combination via a secure format. This allows the officer quick entry to offer assistance.

A collaboration among the Hampshire County Sheriff's Office, the Pelham Police Department, and the Pelham Council on Aging is behind this program. <u>A Deputy Sheriff and Pelham's Chief of Police will install the boxes free of charge.</u>

# **2021 DOG LICENSES EXPIRED ON MARCH 31, 2022**.

There is a two months grace period for renewing without incurring a late fee.

#### LICENSES ISSUED ON OR AFTER MAY 1 WILL INCUR

A LATE FEE, regardless of when they were mailed or placed in Town collection boxes.

Late fee starts on May 1 at \$25 per dog. On June 1 the late fee increases to \$50 per dog. On July 1 the late fee increases to \$75 per dog
